SECTION 1: INVESTIGATION FEE

a. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, whenever the Rensselaer County Probation Department is ordered to conduct an investigation pursuant to Section 653 of the Family Court Act, said department shall be entitled to a fee of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$500.00 from the parties in such proceeding for performing such investigation.

b. The fee imposed by this Section shall be based upon the party's ability to pay the fee and the schedule for payment shall be fixed by the Court issuing the Order for investigation, pursuant to the guidelines issued by the Director of the New York State Division of Probation and Correctional Alternatives, and may in the discretion of the Court be waived when the parties lack sufficient means to pay the fees.

c. The Court shall apportion the fee between the parties based upon the respective financial circumstances of the parties and the equities of the case.

d. All fees imposed pursuant to this Section shall be paid directly to the Rensselaer County Probation Department to be retained and utilized for local probation services, and the same shall not be considered by the New York State Division of Probation when determining state aid reimbursement pursuant to Section 246 of the Executive Law.

SECTION 2: SEVERABILITY

If any clause, sentence or paragraph of this local law shall be adjudged in any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid such adjudication shall not affect, impair or invalidate

Section 5.03(A)(3) of the Rensselaer Charter is amended to read as follows:

3. The Budget Director shall prepare for the County Executive, as Budget Officer, the Tentative Budget to be filed with the Clerk of the Legislature on or before October 20. The Tentative Budget shall include, without modification by the County Executive, those line item appropriation requests for the Legislative Board and the Clerk of the Legislature as are jointly submitted and approved by the Chairman and the Minority Leader in writing to the Budget Officer on or before October 1. The Tentative Budget shall include a budget message explaining the document and policies of the Budget Officer, and a proposed appropriation resolution referring to the Annual Budget and making provision for the conduct of the county government for the ensuing year. Such budget message shall set forth the county wide cumulative tax rate prior to chargebacks under the tentative budget

(If additional space is needed, attach pages the same size as this sheet, and number each.)

and also include a statement as to whether or not the adoption of the tentative budget as the annual budget shall require at least a two-thirds vote of the members of the legislature. Such tentative Budget shall be reviewed by the Budget Officer with the Budget and Finance Committees of the Legislature not less than two (2) days prior to the date of filing with the Clerk of the County Legislature.

Section 2.

Section 5.03(B)(2) of the Rensselaer Charter is amended to read as follows:

2. The Budget and Finance Committee of the Legislature shall review the Tentative Budget as submitted by the Budget Officer and file its report with the Clerk of the Legislature and the County Executive on or before November 20, containing their proposed changes to the Tentative Budget and a statement as to whether or not the adoption of the proposed changes shall cause an increase in the county wide cumulative tax rate and require at least a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the legislature

Section 3.

Section 5.03(B)(4) of the Rensselaer County Charter is amended to read as follows:

4. Following completion of the public hearing and prior to December 2, a committee consisting of the County Executive, the Budget Director, the Chairman of the County Legislature, the Majority and Minority Leaders of the County Legislature, and members of the Budget and Finance Committee shall convene to review the suggested changes to the Tentative Budget. Thereafter, and on or before December 5, the Chairman of the County Legislature shall convene a regular or special meeting of the County Legislature to consider and adopt an Annual Budget. Whenever the tentative budget or the suggested changes to the Tentative Budget shall cause an increase in the county wide cumulative tax rate, the Annual Budget shall be adopted by a vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the members of the legislature; upon a vote of less than two-thirds (2/3) of the members of the legislature, the Annual Budget as last adopted by the County Legislature and as modified by legislative revisions approved by the County Executive shall constitute the Annual Budget for the ensuing year and the County Legislature shall provide for the raising of taxes required by such Annual Budget in the manner and within the time prescribed by law.



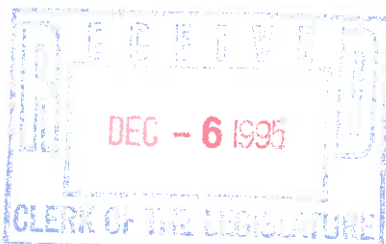

Section 6.02 of the Rensselaer following new section:

Section 6.02 Bureau

The Bureau of Budget

A. The Director of County Budget Officer, financial plans known as

The Director shall appoint such personnel as are necessary to implement the duties of such office and may appoint a Deputy Director authorized to act generally for and in the place of the Director.

B. The Director of Budget shall make surveys, analysis and/or reports of county departments as requested by the County Executive.

C. The Director of Budget is authorized to require from any county departments, regular or special statistical information required in performance of the duties of the office.

B. The Director of Personnel shall have the duties of administration of the Bureau of Personnel, which shall include employee relations, labor relations administration, contract negotiations, health insurance/benefits administration, and other powers and duties as are or may be prescribed by the Civil Service Law and by the County Executive.

SECTION 4.

Section 6.06 of the Rensselaer County Charter is deleted in its entirety and is replaced by the following new section:

Section 6.06 – Bureau of Research and Information Services

The Bureau of Research and Information Services shall be administered by a Director of Research and Information Services.

A. The Director of the Bureau of Research and Information Services shall be appointed by the County Executive.
