Local Law No. 1 of the year 2019

A local law Amending Local Law No. 4 of the Year 2007 and Local Law No. 6 of the Year 1997

Be it enacted by the County Legislature of
the County of Rensselaer as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. Pursuant to recent amendments to Section 458-a of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York, Sections 2, 3 and 4 of Local Law No. 4 of the year 2007, which amended Local Law No. 6 of the Year 1997, which was entitled "A LOCAL LAW ADOPTING AN INCREASED MAXIMUM TAX EXEMPTION FOR ALTERNATIVE VETERANS AS AUTHORIZED BY CHAPTER 417 OF THE LAWS OF NEW YORK FOR 1997", and Local Law No. 6 of the Year 1997, are hereby amended as follows:

Section 2. Qualifying residential real property shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of Fifteen (15%) percent of the assessed value of such property; provided, however, that such exemption shall not exceed Forty-Five thousand dollars (\$45,000.00) or the product of Forty-Five thousand dollars (\$45,000.00) multiplied by the latest state equalization rate for the respective assessing unit, or in the case of a special assessing unit, the latest class ratio, whichever is less.

Section 3. In addition to the exemption provided above in Section 2 of this local law, where the veteran served in a combat theatre or combat zone of operations as documented by the award of a United States campaign ribbon or service medal, qualifying residential real property also shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of Ten (10%) percent of the assessed value of such property; provided, however, that such exemption shall not exceed Thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) or the product of Thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) multiplied by the latest state equalization rate for the respective assessing

unit, or in the case of a special assessing unit, the latest class ratio, whichever is less.

Section 4. In addition to the exemptions provided by Sections 2 and 3 above of this local law, where the veteran received a compensation rating from the United States Veteran's Administration or from the United States Department of Defense because of a service connected disability, qualifying residential real property shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of the product of the assessed value of such property multiplied by Fifty (50%) percent of the veteran's disability rating; provided, however, that such exemption shall not exceed One Hundred and Fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00) or the product of One Hundred and Fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00) multiplied by the latest state equalization rate for the respective assessing unit, or in the case of a special assessing unit, the latest class ratio, whichever is less. For the purpose of this section, where a person who served in the active military, naval or air service during a period of war died in service of a service connected disability, such person shall be deemed to have been assigned a compensation rating of one hundred percent.

Section 5. Further Amendments. Local Law No. 4 of the year 2007 and Local Law No. 6 of the Year 1997 of the County of Rensselaer are further amended to incorporate herein and make a part hereof, the updated definitions contained in New York State Real Property Tax Law Section 458-a (1) as if set forth at length herein. Further, such Local Laws are amended to include all possible participants and qualified entities as are now set forth in Paragraphs 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 of the New York State Real Property Tax Law Section 458-a.


Section 6. Effective date. This local law shall take effect upon filing with the office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York, and with the Office of the State Comptroller of the State of New York.

Local Law No. 2 of the year 2019

A local law of the County of Rensselaer Establishing a Solid Waste Management Facilities One (1) Year Moratorium

County of Rensselaer as follows:

Be It Enacted by the Rensselaer County Legislature as follows:

Section 1. Title

This Local Law shall be known as the "Solid Waste Management Facilities Moratorium Law."

Section 2. Legislative Findings and Purpose

The Rensselaer County Legislature hereby finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the residents of the County of Rensselaer to protect the Hudson River from possible contamination and damage from adverse effects caused by locating Solid Waste Management Facilities, including, but not limited to, landfills and transfer stations, in Rensselaer County within a one (1) mile distance from such river as it adjoins the borders of the County of Rensselaer.

The purpose of this local law is to protect public health and safety, as well as the environment, in Rensselaer County, by requiring a one (1) year moratorium, from the Effective Date of this Local Law, on the approval and permitting of any Solid Waste Management Facilities, including, but not limited to, landfills or transfer stations, in Rensselaer County within a one (1) mile distance from the Hudson River.

Section 3. Moratorium

The Rensselaer County Legislation hereby prohibits, for a period of one (1) year from the effective date of this Local Law, the approval, permitting or opening of any solid waste management facility, including, but not limited to, landfills and transfer stations, in Rensselaer County within a one (1) mile distance from the Hudson River as it adjoins the borders of the County of Rensselaer.

Section 4. Public Hearings

The Rensselaer County Legislature shall conduct public hearings and gather information on what further safeguards, if any, need to be put in place to assure that the public health and environment of Rensselaer County are not put in jeopardy from the operation of any solid waste management facilities, including, but not limited to, landfills and transfer stations, located within one (1) mile of the Hudson River.

Section 5. State Environmental Quality Review Act compliance

This County Legislature determines that the adoption of this Local Law constitutes a "Type II action" as said term is defined in the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), and that no further action with respect to same is required under SEQRA.

Section 6. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, subdivision or other part of this Local Law or its applications shall be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or otherwise invalidate the remainder of this Local Law which shall remain in full force and effect except as limited by such order or judgment.

Section 7. Effective Date

This Local Law shall be effective immediately.

A local law of the County of Rensselaer Establishing a Solid Waste Management Facilities One (1) Year Moratorium and amending Local Law No. 2 of 2019

Be It Enacted by the Rensselaer County Legislature as follows:

Section 1. Title

This Local Law shall be known as the "Solid Waste Management Facilities Moratorium Law." This Local Law amends Local Law No.2 of 2019.

Section 2. Legislative Findings and Purpose

The Rensselaer County Legislature hereby finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the residents of the County of Rensselaer to protect the Hudson River as well as Municipal Drinking Water Sources in the County from possible contamination and damage from adverse effects caused by locating Solid Waste Management Facilities, as defined and applicable under Part 360 et seq. of the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, including, but not limited to landfills, transfer stations and waste processing facilities that accept, process, dispose of, combust, gasify, or transfer solid waste for the purpose of disposal, use as a fuel product or transfer to a facility in Rensselaer County or outside the County within a one (1) mile distance from the Hudson River and its tributaries as it adjoins the borders of the County of Rensselaer, or Municipal Drinking Water Sources in the County, including, but not limited to, the Tomhannock Reservoir and its tributaries.

The purpose of this local law is to protect public health and safety, as well as the environment, in Rensselaer County, by requiring a one (1) year moratorium, from the effective date of this Local Law, on the local and/or state approval of, or local and/or state permitting of, or expansion of, any Solid Waste Management Facilities, as defined and applicable under Part 360 et seq. of the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, including, but not limited to landfills, transfer stations and waste processing facilities that accept, process, dispose of, combust, gasify, or transfer solid waste for the purpose of disposal, use as a fuel product or transfer to a facility in Rensselaer County or outside the County within a one (1) mile distance from the Hudson River and its tributaries or Municipal Drinking Water Sources, including, but not limited to, the Tomhannock Reservoir and its tributaries.

Section 3. Moratorium


