On June 29, 1943, Anthony enlisted into the United States Navy. On July 6, 1943 he entered into active service in Camden, New Jersey. Gunner's Mate Second Class Anthony Cybulski served aboard the LCI-R 651 during World War II near the island of Iwo Jima. He was honorably discharged from the US Navy at Lido Beach, Long Island, N.Y. on March 15, 1946. For his honorable service to his country, Gunner's Mate Second Class Anthony Cybulski was awarded the Naval Achievement Medal, Navy Commendation Ribbon with valor-device, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with arrowhead device, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal with 2 Service Stars, Combat Action Ribbon, Navy Occupation Service Medal w/Asia Bar, American Campaign Medal, WWII Victory Medal, Philippine Liberation Medal, Philippine Independence Medal, WWII Honorable Discharge "Ruptured Duck", WWII Pacific Campaign Commemorative Medal – 1941-1945, and the 50th Anniversary WWII Commemorative Medal.

Anthony "Shorty" married Eleanor "Peggy" (Riddle) Cybulski on November 25, 1949 in Farmingdale, NJ. From that union, they had three sons: Joseph, James, and Thomas and one daughter, Toni Anne.
