While serving, he became the recipient of the National Defense Service Medal, Navy Unit Commendation, Navy Achievement Medal with Combat "V", Combat Action Ribbon, Vietnam Service Medal with Four Bronze Stars, Vietnam Campaign Medal with 1960 Device, and FMF Combat Operations Insignia. Allen was honorably discharged on March 25, 1970. He was also enlisted in the United States Naval Reserve until the year 1978.
