RESOLUTION IMPLORING THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO IMMEDIATELY SUSPEND AND AMEND THE BAIL AND DISCOVERY REFORM LAWS THAT ENDANGER THE PEOPLE OF NEW YORK AND URGING NYS OFFICIALS TO STOP USING THE NYS BUDGET TO ADOPT NON-BUDGETARY POLICIES AND PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, Protecting the people from harm by enforcing the rule of law is the foundational role of government; and

WHEREAS, County governments are vested by the State of New York with the responsibility to protect the most vulnerable among us, including the socioeconomically disadvantaged, the disabled, the elderly, and children; and

WHEREAS, No group is more vulnerable than the victims of crime, and a just society demands that crime victims should be recognized as key participants within the criminal justice system and be treated with dignity, fairness, and respect; and

WHEREAS, In the final stages of adopting its FY 2020 budget, the State of New York used the New York State budget process to impose yet another policy change of sweeping criminal justice reforms into the budget which sets spending and revenue estimates for the operation of New York State; and

WHEREAS, This Legislative Body feels strongly that the New York State Budget provides legal authority to spend money, and should not be used to adopt new policies and reforms that should be debated and adopted separately, and on their own merits, not as part of the State's spending plan; and

WHEREAS, Under bail reform, that took effect on January 1, 2020, judges were stripped of their discretion to set bail for many specific enumerated crimes, which means those suspected of committing these crimes can no longer be held in jail after their arrest, regardless of the strength of the case against these defendants, or the length of the potential sentence faced by these defendants, or the extent of the harm allegedly caused by these defendants, and instead these defendants will be released back into the general public; and

WHEREAS, These crimes include those that result in the deaths of innocent people, including several subcategories of homicide and manslaughter, resulting in those responsible for these deaths being released back into the community of grieving families; and

WHEREAS, Since the implementation of these reforms, New Yorkers have seen countless reports of dangerous repeat criminals being released shortly after being arrested for committing serious crimes; and

WHEREAS, In Rensselaer County we have already seen career criminals released shortly after arrest, and have seen over two dozen inmates released from Rensselaer County Jail; and

WHEREAS, All of the offenders that are released without bail are at risk of not showing up for court, thereby placing a burden on public employees who, under this law, are required to send multiple court appearance reminders to these offenders, as well as police officers and District Attorneys who must commit resources to tracking and pursuing those who evade prosecution; and

WHEREAS, The discovery mandates imposed by the State of New York requires police and District Attorney to turn over voluminous trial-related materials to defense attorneys within 15 days, creating a mandate that will inevitably not be achieved in some cases and may result in the inability of the People to properly prosecute cases against criminal defendants; and

WHEREAS, Discovery reform has resulted in an opportunity for defendants to gain access to crime scenes that may include a victim's residence and contact information, thereby giving defendants accused of burglaries, assaults, rapes and other crimes committed in victims' homes the right to return to those same homes; and

WHEREAS, Discovery reform requires prosecutors to turn over the names and contact information of the victims and the witnesses to the defendant in the same 15 day time period; and

WHEREAS, The issues mentioned heretofore will undeniably impact past, present and future victims of crime in a negative manner, and in so doing, the bail and discovery reforms adopted by the State of New York will themselves further victimize these innocent individuals; and

WHEREAS, These bail and discovery laws, in their current form, represent a clear and present danger to society, will tilt the scales of justice in favor of suspected criminals and away from innocent crime victims, and risk reversing decades of bipartisan progress made by the State of New York in reducing crime; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Rensselaer County Legislature, once again, implores the State of New York to immediately amend or suspend these laws by emergency executive authority, or by any other means deemed possible by the State, and, be it further

Whereas, She was educated at Sacred Heart Elementary School and Catholic Central High School. In 1952, Doreen graduated from Catholic Central High School at the proud age of 16. After graduation from High School, she went on to graduate from St Mary's Hospital School of Nursing in Amsterdam, where she became a Registered Nurse; and

WHEREAS, Doreen married her beloved husband Tom on September 14, 1957 and during this time, she also began her governmental career working as a nurse for the NYS Training School for Girls in Wynantskill; and

WHEREAS, In 1972, she graduated from the first class of the Mortuary Science program at HVCC and became a Licensed Funeral Director after completing her apprenticeship a year later. Following this, she continued her governmental career as Town Clerk of the Town of North Greenbush; and

WHEREAS, In November 1989, Doreen was elected to the Rensselaer County Legislature, taking office January 1, 1990 and held the seat until December 31, 1992, when she was appointed Deputy County Clerk and on January 20, 1993 she was appointed County Clerk by Governor Mario M. Cuomo. She later ran and won the election for Rensselaer County Clerk and to this day is the only woman who has ever held that position. During her tenure as Clerk, for a short time she became the Chair of the Rensselaer County Democratic Committee. She retired from the Clerk's Office on December 31, 1997 having chosen not to run for a second term; and

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WHEREAS, Doreen will be sorely missed by her children: Kathryn (Jeff Brien) Connolly and Thomas S (Sharon) Connolly, Jr.; her grandsons: Thomas A Connolly and Ryan Michael Stouffer as well as nieces, nephews and cousins; and

WHEREAS, This Legislative Body pauses to recognize the life of Doreen M. (O'Connor) Connolly and the immeasurable contributions she made to Rensselaer County, North Greenbush and her community; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Rensselaer County Legislature does hereby pause in its deliberations in memory of Doreen M. (O'Connor) Connolly, and to extend its deepest sympathy to her family, fully confident that her contributions to her community will live on to serve as a legacy for all; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Legislature transmit a copy of this resolution, suitably engrossed, to the family of Doreen M. (O'Connor) Connolly.
