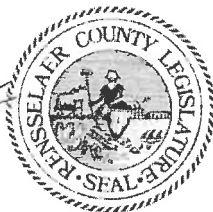

**WHEREAS**, One of the defendants, Allergen has offered to settle the claims of public Nuisance against it by paying Rensselaer County a one-time sum of no less than \$254,186.61 for restitution and abatement and agreeing to not manufacture, sell or promote opioids; and

**WHEREAS**, Rensselaer County has been advised by its litigation counsel to approve this settlement; and

**WHEREAS**, It is in the best interest of Rensselaer County to settle the Action with Allergen and to resolve the Action with respect to Allergen and avoid protracted litigation; now, therefore, be it



**WHEREAS**, The Rensselaer County Public Defender, the Rensselaer County Conflict Defender, and the Rensselaer Public Administrator received an award (Contract Number CSTWIDEHH37) of \$986,287.15 for the second year of a five year grant award of \$7,397,153.61 from the NYS OILS, for the period commencing April 1, 2018 through March 31, 2023, to enact the Statewide Expansion of Hurrell-Harring pursuant to the 2017 amendment to County Law § 722-e and enactment of Executive Law § 832 (4), pursuant to the authority granted by Resolution No. G/50/21; and

**WHEREAS,** There are unexpended monies for the Office of the Public Defender, Office of the Conflict Defender and Office of the County Attorney; and

**WHEREAS**, The 2022 theme is "Cultivating a Community of Care": Recognizing that the prevention of sexual violence and supporting survivors is a shared responsibility among all community members. In addition, lifting the stigma around sexual assault will encourage victims to come forward and prosecute attackers and allow authorities to provide victims assistance and help to heal; now, therefore be it
