	The intent and purpose of this Local Law No. 2 of the year 2023 is to adopt technical amendments to Local Law 1 of the year 2023 which provided a real property tax exemption for volunteer firefighters and emergency medical personnel and their unremarried surviving spouses in accordance with Section 466-a of the Real Property Tax Law.
Section 2.	Section 6 of Local Law 1 of the year 2023 is hereby amended to read as follows:
	Section 6. Un-remarried Surviving Spouses of Volunteers with at Least Twenty

Years of Service

An un-remarried surviving spouse of a volunteer firefighter or volunteer ambulance worker with at least twenty years of service may receive the real property tax exemption if:

- 1. Such un-remarried surviving spouse is certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service as an un-remarried spouse of a deceased enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated volunteer ambulance service;
- 2. Such deceased volunteer had been an enrolled member for at least twenty years; and
- 3. Such deceased volunteer and un-remarried spouse had been receiving the exemption for such property prior to the death of such volunteer.

WHEREAS, Based on the evaluation of the proposals, Siemens Industry, Inc. ("Siemens") was selected to develop and implement a performance-based energy savings and operations plan; and

WHEREAS, Siemens has provided the County with Facility Improvement Measures Report for the Rensselaer County Cornell or Agriculture and Life Science Building dated April 17, 2023 (the "Agriculture Building Report") which sets forth detailed design plans for improvements of the Agriculture and Life Science Building, including LED lighting upgrade with fixture replacement, lighting controls - enlighted, install new AHU/VRF for conference room, needlepoint bipolar ionization, Siemens Card Access, Security, closed circuit TV and fire alarm, installation of new electrical panels and utility delivery system and necessary improvements to the Signal Building site related thereto, new generator installation, new windows installation, commissioning, testing and balancing, renovation of floors - upfit, install security cameras, install exterior pole lights, structural modifications and steel lintels, overhead communication line and WAP upgrade, HVAC piping and ductwork modification, equipment to utility interconnect, National Grid, signal booster for operational communications improvements; now, therefore, be it

Section 1. In accordance with Section 9-103 of the Act, the County is hereby authorized to enter into an amended and restated energy performance contract ("Agreement") with Siemens with respect to the work related to the Agriculture Building Report, pursuant to which Siemens will provide equipment, capital improvements, repairs, ongoing preventative maintenance and other services with the total cost not to exceed \$3,186,115, plus assurance program payments not to exceed \$1,827 annually, to improve the energy efficiency of, and install related improvements for, the Rensselaer County Agriculture and Life Science Building.

Section 2. The Chief Fiscal Officer, as Chief Fiscal Officer of the County, is hereby authorized to negotiate and deliver on behalf of the County the Agreement and all other certificates or instruments required in connection therewith provided, however, that all amounts payable by the County pursuant to the Agreement shall be subject to annual appropriation of such payments by the County Legislature. The power to prescribe the terms, forms and covenants of the Agreement and all other certificates or instruments required in connection therewith is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer, as Chief Fiscal Officer.

Section 3. This Resolution is not subject to a mandatory or permissive referendum.

Section 4. The County hereby determines that the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations thereunder have previously been satisfied with respect to the expenditures authorized by this Resolution.

The period of probable usefulness of the specific object or purpose herein authorized and for which \$3,513,421 of said serial bonds are herein authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00(a)(12)(a)(1) of the Local Finance Law, is twenty-five (25) years.

Section 2. Serial bonds (and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds) in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$3,513,421 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by Section 2 of this resolution will exceed five (5) years. WHEREAS, The County has previously authorized the purchase of the property ("99 Troy Road Property") consisting of approximately 9.78 acres, as improved with an office building consisting of approximately 62,848 of space and corresponding parking, and as located at 99 Troy Road in the Town of East Greenbush, New York, together with the making of certain improvement to the 99 Troy Road Property (the "Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, The County has received a proposal for the financing of the making of the Improvements through Siemens Public, Inc. or related Siemens entities (hereinafter, "Siemens Public Finance"); and

WHEREAS, The County desires to finance the making of the Improvements through the issuance by the County of bonds and/notes and the sale of such bonds and/or notes by Siemens Public Finance; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** That by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Legislature, as follows:

 $\underline{\text{Section 1}}$ . The County of Rensselaer (the "County") is hereby authorized to undertake the following:

Undertake certain up-fit to the building located at 99 Troy Road in the Town of East Greenbush, New York (the "Building"), and in connection with such up-fit, to acquire furnishings, equipment, machinery and/or apparatus. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$1,682,428, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefore. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$1,682,428 serial bonds of the County to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the County to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

The Building is of Class "A" construction as defined by Section 11.00(a)(11)(a) of the Local Finance Law.

The period of probable usefulness of the specific object or purpose herein authorized and for which \$1,682,428 of said serial bonds are herein authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00(a)(12)(a)(1) of the Local Finance Law, is twenty-five (25) years.

Section 2. Serial bonds (and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds) in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,682,428 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by Section 2 of this resolution will exceed five (5) years. Current funds are not required by the Local Finance Law to be provided as a down payment prior to the issuance of the serial bonds authorized by said Section or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation thereof because the County intends to comply with the provisions of Section 107.00 of the Local Finance Law with respect thereto.

Section 4. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and said serial bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocable pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Local Finance Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals of said notes and of Section 21.00, Section 23.00, Section 50.00, Sections 56.00 to 60.00, Section 62.00, Section 63.00, and Section 164.00 of the Local Finance Law, the powers and duties of the County Legislature pertaining or incidental to the sale and issuance of the obligations herein authorized and the reissuance of lost, destroyed, partially destroyed or defaced obligations, including but not limited to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, are hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer of the County.

- Section 6. The Chief Fiscal Officer is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, if applicable, as "qualified tax-exempt bonds" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.
- <u>Section 7</u>. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:
- (a) (1) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or
- (2) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with,
- and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- (b) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.
- <u>Section 8</u>. The temporary use of available funds of the County, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised, or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the purpose or purposes described in this resolution.
- Section 9. This resolution shall constitute the declaration (or reaffirmation) of the County's "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized in this resolution with the proceeds of the bonds, notes, or other obligations authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.
- Section 10. The Chief Fiscal Officer is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure agreement with the initial purchaser of the bonds or notes authorized by this resolution, containing provisions which are satisfactory to such purchaser in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.
- Section 11. The County hereby determines that the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations thereunder have previously been satisfied with respect to the expenditures authorized by this Resolution.
- Section 12. To the extent permitted by Section 58.00(f) of the Local Finance Law, the Chief Fiscal Officer is further authorized to accept bids submitted in an electronic format for any bonds or notes of the County.

WHEREAS, On November 9, 1918, inspired John McCrae's poem, Monia wrote a poem in response called "We Shall Keep the Faith". The third stance reads "And now the Torch and Poppy Red we wear in honor of our dead. Fear not that ye have died for naught; We'll teach the lesson that ye wrought In Flanders Fields" vowing to always wear a red poppy as a symbol of remembrance for those who served in the war; and

WHEREAS, After the war was over, Monia returned to the University of Georgia and taught a class of disabled servicemen; realizing the need to provide financial and occupational support for these servicemen, she pursued the idea of selling silk poppies as a means of raising funds to assist disabled veterans; and

#### RESOLUTION CELEBRATING JUNETEENTH IN RENSSEALER COUNTY

WHEREAS, Juneteenth - also known as Freedom Day, Jubilee Day, Liberation Day, and Emancipation Day - is a holiday celebrating the emancipation of those who had been enslaved in the United States. Originating in Galveston, Texas, it is now celebrated annually on the 19th of June throughout the United States, with varying official recognition. It is commemorated on the anniversary date of the June 19, 1865 announcement by Union Army General Gordon Granger, proclaiming freedom from slavery in Texas; and

WHEREAS, Early celebrations involved church centered community gatherings, which spread across the South and became more commercialized in the 1920s and 1930s. When the Great Depression forced many Black people off their farms and into cities to find work, African Americans had difficulty taking the day off to celebrate. During the 1950s and 1960s, the Civil Rights Movement focused its attention on expanding freedom and integration for African Americans, and as a result Juneteenth celebrations dwindled again; and

WHEREAS, In the late 1970s the Texas Legislature declared Juneteenth a "holiday of significance (...) particularly to the Blacks of Texas," and Texas became the first state to establish Juneteenth as a state holiday; and

WHEREAS, In the meantime many States have followed suit. Hawaii just passed legislation to honor Juneteenth and is poised to become the  $49^{\rm th}$  State to recognize the day, once the bill is signed into law, leaving South Dakota as the only State remaining that doesn't. Activists are pushing Congress to recognize Juneteenth as a national holiday; and

WHEREAS, June 28, 2023 marks the fifty-fourth anniversary of the Stonewall Uprising, when patrons of New York City's Stonewall Inn resisted police harassment and brutality, resulting in six nights of protests and serving as a catalyst for the LGBTQ+ rights movement in the United States and around the world; and

WHEREAS, On the one-year anniversary of the Stonewall Uprising, thousands of people marched in the streets of Manhattan from the Stonewall Inn to Central Park in what was then called "Christopher Street Liberation Day", becoming America's first gay pride parade; and

WHEREAS, The decades since have been a time of both struggle and celebration for the LGBTQ+ community. Despite increased support and acceptance, young LGBTQ+ people still face many challenges. Without accepting families, they are 140 percent more likely to experience homelessness and nearly five times more likely to attempt suicide; and

WHEREAS, As a result of bullying and discrimination, many LGBTQ+ middle and high school students avoid school activities or miss school entirely, which affects their academic success and mental health; and

WHEREAS, The Rensselaer County Legislature recognizes the urgency of its charge to foster a responsive, caring, and inclusive culture where all feel valued, supported, and hopeful; and

WHEREAS, Rensselaer County has a richly diverse LGBTQ+ community that includes people from all walks of life who should be able to live without fear of prejudice, discrimination, or violence; and
