RESOLUTION CALLING ON MEMBERS OF THE NEW YORK STATE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY TO REFORM THE STATE'S COMPETENCY RESTORATION PROCESS AND SUPPORT THE PASSAGE OF S.1874

(BROUK)/A.5063 (GUNTHER) - MENTAL HEALTH

WHEREAS, This Resolution is filed with the Rensselaer County Legislature by the Rensselaer County Executive; and

WHEREAS, Section §730 of the Criminal Procedure Law ("CPL") provides that defendants charged with felonies who are mentally ill and/or developmentally disabled and who are determined by a Court to be unable to understand the charges against them or participate in their own defense (often called "730's") are sent to New York State-operated forensic hospitals solely for the purpose of trying to restore them to competency so they can stand trial; and

WHEREAS, The origin of CPL §730 dates back over five decades to the laws of 1970, and parts of it have been declared to be unconstitutional; and

WHEREAS, Competency restoration provides necessary medications but primarily provides services such as courtroom training to familiarize the defendant with courtroom procedures so they can participate in their trial; and

WHEREAS, It is believed that a 730 commitment helps the mentally ill or developmentally disabled person to get treatment; and

WHEREAS, In the cases for which restoration is appropriate, most Defendants can generally be restored within 90-150 days; and

WHEREAS, Unfortunately, there are also numerous situations where Defendants have been kept in restoration for periods of three, six, or even ten years; and

WHEREAS, These lengthy confinements have been declared to be unconstitutional by the U.S. Supreme Court as shown in the case of Jackson v. Indiana (1972), which provides that States may not indefinitely confine criminal Defendants solely on the basis of incompetence to stand trial; and

WHEREAS, The New York State Office of Mental Health ("OMH") has diverged from agreements with the County Mental Health Commissioners/Directors of Community Services to provide specific and timely information on the clients/defendants ordered to restoration; and

WHEREAS, The SFY 2020-21 budget required Counties to pay one hundred percent (100%) of the OMH State Operations costs for individuals receiving court-ordered mental health competency restoration services at State-operated Forensic Psychiatric Centers; and

WHEREAS, As the full payors of these services, the Commissioners must have timely access to any pertinent client information as deemed necessary to effectively manage their responsibilities under the Mental Hygiene Law; and

WHEREAS, The County cost of these services is over \$1,300.00 per day and current statute does not require a timeline be established for when a Defendant is unable to be restored; and

WHEREAS, The County cost of restoration for one Defendant can be upwards of \$400,000.00 per year; and

WHEREAS, In New York State, Counties, through the County tax levy, already bear an overwhelming portion of the financial burden for supporting individuals suffering from serious mental illness, and the requirement to assume one hundred percent (100%) of 730.20 competency restoration costs has taken away millions of dollars from critical behavioral health programming in the community; and

WHEREAS, Given the advances in the behavioral health and the modernization of the criminal justice system, it is time for the State to reform the statutory authority governing competency restoration to ensure that only individuals who are appropriate subjects of 730 court orders are sent for restoration in accordance with the current state of these two systems; and

WHEREAS, The Legislature has introduced S.1874 (Brouk)/A.5063 (Gunther), which seeks to address the reforms necessary to update the archaic requirements of current statute, many which have been deemed unconstitutional and includes a critical requirement to reinvest any savings derived by the counties back into the local mental hygiene systems of care; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That Rensselaer County calls on the State Senate, State Assembly and New York Governor Hochul to enact into law S.1874 (Brouk)/A.5063 (Gunther).

WHEREAS, The Interim Final Rule expressly lists Investments in Government Services as an eligible use. In Sections 602 (c)(1)(C) and 603 (c)(1)(C) of the Act provide recipients with broad latitude to use the Fiscal Recovery Funds for the provision of government services. Government services can include, but not limited to, maintenance or pay-go funded building of infrastructure. Pay-go infrastructure funding refers to the practice of funding capital projects with cashon-hand from taxes, fees, grants, and other sources, rather than with borrowed sums; and

whereas, The statute authorizes State, territorial, and Tribal governments; counties; metropolitan cities; and non-entitlement units of local government (counties, metropolitan cities, and non-entitlement units of local government are collectively referred to as 'local governments') to transfer amounts paid from the Fiscal Recovery Funds to several specified entities. By permitting these transfers, Congress recognized the importance of providing flexibility to governments seeking to achieve the greatest impact with their funds, including by working with other levels or units of government or private entities to assist recipient governments in carrying out their programs. This includes special-purpose districts that perform specific functions in the community, such as fire, water, sewer, or mosquito abatement districts; and

RESOLUTION URGING NEW YORK STATE GOVERNOR HOCHUL AND THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION (DEC) TO DENY THE PERMIT RENEWAL FOR THE DUNN CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION (C&D) LANDFILL

WHEREAS, The Rensselaer County Legislature has repeatedly called on the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) to deny the permit renewal for the Dunn Construction and Demolition (C&D) Landfill, which borders the Rensselaer City School District; and

WHEREAS, Despite the expiration of Dunn C&D Landfill's operating permit two years ago, the facility continues to operate in dangerous proximity to the school, with 100 tractor trailers carrying construction and demolition debris daily through quiet residential streets; and

WHEREAS, DEC officials have acknowledged that the initial approval to open a landfill next to a school serving more than 1,000 students was a mistake; and

WHEREAS, Landfills are well-known concentrated sources of greenhouse gas emissions and other air pollutants, including PM2.5, which degrade human health; and

WHEREAS, It has been reported that the DEC's internal landfill siting requirements, updated in June 2023, prohibit new landfills from being sited within 1,000 feet of an existing school; and

WHEREAS, Despite these requirements, it is believed that the DEC and Dunn C&D Landfill owners have not completed thorough testing of air quality and potential health effects related to chronic landfill exposure; and

WHEREAS, These failures continue to cause immense concern among Rensselaer residents, Rensselaer Mayor Michael Stammel, The Rensselaer Environmental Coalition, the Town of East Greenbush, and other interested parties; and

WHEREAS, In 2019, New York passed the nation's most progressive climate law, the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA), which requires the DEC to evaluate if Dunn C&D Landfill creates an overconcentration of pollution and undue health risks; and

WHEREAS, A thorough evaluation will likely find that a full-use industrial landfill bordering a K-12 public school in a densely populated area meets this threshold and poses a bona fide public health risk; and

WHEREAS, Failure to close Dunn C&D Landfill further damages the very communities the CLCPA was designed to protect; and

WHEREAS, The DEC's decision on this issue sends a strong message to the nation of what New York values more — its children's health or out-of-state corporate interests; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Rensselaer County Legislature once again calls on the DEC and Governor Kathy Hochul to apply their own policies and close Dunn C&D Landfill; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the closure of Dunn C&D Landfill and the denial of its permit renewal will set a precedent for New York to be a true and effective leader on climate justice issues; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Legislature shall send a copy of this resolution to Governor Kathy Hochul, Lieutenant Governor Antonio Delgado, Senator Jake Ashby, Assemblyman John McDonald, Assemblyman Scott Bendett, NYSDEC Interim Commissioner Sean Mahar, NYS Department of Health Commissioner James V. WHEREAS, The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 provides \$5 billion towards eliminating contaminants in our waterways and drinking water across the United States over the next five years; and

WHEREAS. Water quality is a global problem as well as a local problem, as Rensselaer County has had ground water contamination. Understanding, awareness, and becoming involved in the protection of our waterways are key to keeping our water free of widespread contaminants; and

WHEREAS, Everyone can help by participating in National Water Quality Month by understanding the economic value of water, addressing pollution issues and contaminants, getting involved in their community by taking steps towards cleaning up waterways and conserving water; and

WHEREAS, Some measurable steps towards cleaning up waterways and conserving water in our homes are to: refrain from using antibacterial soaps or cleaning products, refrain from disposing expired medications down the sink or other appliances, refrain from putting anything but water down the storm drains and avoiding agricultural runoff. It is best for the environment to choose nontoxic household products when possible, pick up after pets and avoid paving real properties; now, therefore, be it
