

DANIEL F. MALONEY
1949–2007

FAMILY HISTORY:

Daniel Francis Maloney was born in Cohoes, New York on June 27, 1949 to parents Daniel F. Maloney and Gabrielle (Laverdière) Maloney. Daniel had two sisters: Shirley and Lorraine and two brothers: Michael and Lawrence. Daniel grew up in Cohoes and later moved to Pittstown, N.Y.

EDUCATION:

He graduated from Cohoes High School in 1968. He attended Hudson Valley Community College and graduated in 1982 with an associate in electrical construction degree.

HISTORY:

Daniel enlisted in the United States Army on August 12, 1968 in Albany, New York. He served in Vietnam from February 1, 1969 to June 30, 1969, in the 101st Airborne Division. Sergeant Maloney completed two tours of duty in Vietnam. For his honorable service to his country, Sergeant Daniel F. Maloney was awarded the Army Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Bronze Star Medal, Marksman Badge with Sharpshooter and M-14 bars, and Vietnam Campaign Medal with 1960 device. He was awarded the Colonel Robert Craner Service Medal from Mayor John McDonald and in April 2011, Daniel was placed on the Memory Honor Roll Call in Washington, D.C.

PERSONAL:

Danny married Patricia (Cronin) Maloney on April 7, 1973 at the Sacred Heart Church in Cohoes, N.Y. and from that union they had two sons: Joseph and Tory and one daughter, Angela. They were blessed with three grandchildren: Tory Jr., Joshua, and Erica.

WORK EXPERIENCE:

Daniel was employed with Bendix in Green Island for several years. He then gained employment at the Watervliet Arsenal and retired after 25 years of service as a licensed master electrician.

COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES/ORGANIZATIONS:

He was a communicant of St. Augustine's Church in Lansingburgh and an active member of the Agent Orange Veterans Programs. Danny enjoyed going to camp with his wife and family for long weekends to fish and see

friends. Danny took special interest in always helping others, no matter the time of day, you could always count on him.

Sadly, Daniel F. Maloney passed away on February 23, 2007 and was buried at Gerald B.H. Solomon Saratoga National Cemetery, Schuylerville, New York.
