RESOLUTION APPROVING MEMO OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF RENSSELAER AND RENSSELAER COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND THE UNITED PUBLIC SERVICE EMPLOYEES' UNION COALITION OF PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION - BUREAU OF HUMAN RESOURCES

WHEREAS, This Resolution is filed with the Rensselaer County Legislature by the Rensselaer County Executive; and

WHEREAS, The County of Rensselaer ("County"), the Rensselaer County Sheriff's Office ("RCSO")(jointly as "Employers") and the United Public Service Employees' Union Coalition of Public Safety Division ("UPSEU") (collectively as "Parties")have engaged in negotiations to arrive at Memo of Agreement ("MOA"); and

WHEREAS, UPSEU understands and agrees that the MOA is subject to review and approval by the Rensselaer County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, Once approved by the legislature, the Employers will recognize UPSEU as the exclusive representative of the command staff employees permanently assigned to the RSCO at the County Jail, excluding the titles of Captain and Chief; and

WHEREAS, UPSEU shall be deemed the representative of the above-referenced employees effective at 9:00am on the first business day following the Legislature's approval of the MOA; and

WHEREAS, The Parties understand and agree that the current benefits and terms and conditions of employment for the covered employees in place as of the date of employers sign this MOA shall remain in place and no modifications shall be made to the benefits and terms and conditions until a collective bargaining agreement is agreed upon between the Employers and UPSEU; and

WHEREAS, The Parties will meet to begin negotiations for an original collective bargaining agreement as soon as practicable following legislative approval of the MOA, with the collective bargaining agreement being effective when agreed upon by the Parties; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Rensselaer County Legislature hereby approves the Memo of Agreement and hereby authorizes the Rensselaer County Executive, or his designee, to enter into a collective bargaining agreement with the UPSEU which incorporates the terms and conditions of the above-referenced Settlement Agreement, subject to the approval as to form by the Rensselaer County Attorney.

WHEREAS, This Resolution is filed with the Rensselaer County Legislature by the Rensselaer County Executive; and

WHEREAS, The Rensselaer County Office of the Sheriff ("Office") is seeking Legislative authorization to enter into a service contract to cover continued operation of the current inmate jail management system, Sally-Port, with the sole source provider, Black Creek Integrated System Corporation; and

WHEREAS, The Office has budgeted the necessary funds in their 2023 maintenance appropriation code A.3150.04420 for the purpose of said contract; and

WHEREAS, The current inmate management system contains 30 user licensing workstation agreements and is accessible to approximately 170 staff members; and

WHEREAS, The system equipment and software provide vital interfacing with VINE NY (Victim Notification), Comnetix (Digital Fingerprinting), Watch Tour Plug-In and security touch screen integration; and

WHEREAS, The system also establishes and maintains a database utilized to produce mandated reports such as the New York State Commission of Corrections' Daily Population Report, the Sheriff's Annual Report as well as revenue generating reports such as Parole Reimbursement Reports, State Ready Reports, Social Security Reports and Alien Assistance Reports; and

WHEREAS, The service contract is necessary to ensure continued technical support, software updates, training and user input into future assessment and needs of next generation software packages; and

WHEREAS, This contract is being procured in accordance with Purchasing Guidelines adopted by the County of Rensselaer; and
