RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF RENSSELAER, NEW YORK, IMPOSING TAXES ON SALES AND USES OF TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY AND OF CERTAIN SERVICES, AND ON OCCUPANCY OF HOTEL ROOMS AND AMUSEMENT CHARGES, PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 29 OF THE TAX LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

Be it enacted by the County Legislature of the County of Rensselaer, New York, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The first sentence of section two of Resolution no. G/142/68 as enacted in nineteen hundred sixty-eight, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2: Imposition of sales tax. On and after December 1, 1982, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid a tax of three percent upon, and for the period commencing September 1, 1994 and ending November 30, 2025, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid an additional tax of one percent upon:

- **SECTION 2:** Subdivision (f) of section three of Resolution no. G/142/68 as enacted in nineteen hundred and sixty-eight, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:
  - (f) With respect to the additional tax of one percent imposed for the period commencing September 1, 1994 and ending November 30, 2025, the provisions of subdivisions (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of this section apply, except that for the purposes of this subdivision, all references in said subdivisions (a), (b), (c), and (d) to an effective date shall be read as referring to September 1, 1994, all references in said subdivision (a) to the date four months prior to the effective date shall be read as referring to May 1, 1994, and the reference in subdivision (b) to the date immediately preceding the effective date shall be read as referring to August 31, 1994. Nothing herein shall be deemed to exempt from tax at the rate in effect prior to September 1, 1994 any transaction which may not be subject to the additional tax imposed effective on that date.
- **SECTION 3:** Section four of Resolution no. G/142/68 as enacted in nineteen hundred sixty-eight, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

SECTION 4: Imposition of compensating use tax. (a) Except to the extent that property or services have already been or will be subject to the sales tax under this enactment, there is hereby imposed on every person a use tax for the use within this

taxing jurisdiction on and after September 1, 1994, except as otherwise exempted under this enactment, (A) of any tangible personal property purchased at retail, (B) of any tangible personal property (other than computer software used by the author or other creator) manufactured, processed or assembled by the user, (i) if items of the same kind of tangible personal property are offered for sale by him in the regular course of business or (ii) if items are used as such or incorporated into a structure, building or real property, by a contractor, subcontractor or repairman in erecting structures or buildings, or building on, or otherwise adding to, altering, improving, maintaining, servicing or repairing real property, property or land, as the terms real property, property or land are defined in the real property tax law, if items of the same kind are not offered for sale as such by such contractor, subcontractor or repairman or other user in the regular course of business, (C) of any of the services described in paragraphs (1), (7) and (8) of subdivision (c) of section two, (D) of any tangible personal property, however acquired, where not acquired for purposes of resale, upon which any of the services described under paragraphs (2), (3) and (7) of subdivision (c) of section two have been performed, (E) of any telephone answering service described in subdivision (b) of section two; (F) of any computer software written or otherwise created by the user the user offers software of a similar kind for sale as such or as a component part of other property in the regular course of business, G) of any prepaid telephone calling service, and (H) of any gas or electricity described in subdivision (b) of section two of the enactment.

- (b) For purposes of clause (A) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994 and ending November 30, 2025, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2023, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent, of the consideration given or contracted to be given for such property, or for the use of such property, including any charges for shipping or delivery as described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one, but excluding any credit for tangible personal property accepted in part payment and intended for resale.
- (c) For purposes of subclause (i) of clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994 and ending November 30, 2025, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2023, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent, of the price at which items of the same kind of tangible personal property are offered for sale by the user, and the mere storage, keeping, retention or withdrawal from storage of tangible personal property by the person who manufactured, processed or assembled such property shall not be deemed a taxable use by him; provided, however, that if the user

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uses such an item itself on its own premises (not including making a gift of such tangible personal property), solely in the conduct of the user's own business operations, and the item retains its characteristic as tangible personal property when so used, the tax shall be at the rate, and on the consideration, described in subdivision (d) of this section.

- (d) For purposes of subclause (ii) of clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994 and ending November 30, 2025, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2023, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent, of the consideration given or contracted to be given for the tangible personal property manufactured, processed or assembled into the tangible personal property the use of which is subject to tax, including any charges for shipping or delivery as described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one.
- (e) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, for purposes of clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, there shall be no tax on any portion of such price which represents the value added by the user to tangible personal property which he fabricates and installs to the specifications of an addition or capital improvement to real property, property or land, as the terms real property, property or land are defined in the real property tax law, over and above the prevailing normal purchase price prior to such fabrication of such tangible personal property which a manufacturer, producer or assembler would charge an unrelated contractor who similarly fabricated and installed such tangible personal property to the specifications of an addition or capital improvement to such real property, property or land.
- For purposes of clauses (C), (D), and (E) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994 and ending November 30, 2025, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2023, the tax shall be at of three percent, of the consideration given rate contracted to be given for the service, including consideration for any tangible personal property transferred in conjunction with the performance of the service and also including any charges for shipping and delivery of the property transferred and of the tangible personal property upon which the service was performed as such charges are described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one.
- (g) For purposes of clause (F) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994 and ending November 30, 2025, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2023, the tax shall be at the rate of

three percent, of the consideration given or contracted to be given for the tangible personal property which constitutes the

- **SECTION 4:** Subdivision (k) of section six of Resolution no. G/142/68 as enacted in nineteen hundred sixty-eight, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
  - (k) Exemption of certain energy sources and related services from additional one percent rate of tax. THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF RENSSELAER, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The County of Rensselaer, New York (the "County") is hereby authorized to undertake an Aeration Improvement and Miscellaneous Upgrades Project for the Rensselaer County Sewer District. The project consists of the engineering study, design and construction of improvements to the District's existing aeration and sludge processing systems located at the Rensselaer County Sewer District, together with any necessary site work and the acquisition and installation of furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus for the foregoing purposes, together with the preparation of planning, engineering and feasibility studies and review. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof (including costs relating to the issuance of the obligations authorized by this resolution), is an amount not to exceed \$14,214,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of an amount not to exceed \$13,914,000 of serial bonds (and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds) in such series and amounts as may be necessary to pay a portion of the cost thereof, but in no event in excess of \$13,914,000, to pay a portion of the costs of the capital project, together with a Water Quality Improvement Project grant in the amount of \$300,000 to pay the balance of the costs of the capital project.

The period of probable usefulness of the specific object or purpose herein authorized and for which said serial bonds are herein authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00a.4 of the New York Local Finance Law (the "Law"), is thirty (30) years.

**Section 2.** Serial bonds (and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds) in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$13,914,000 to finance said appropriation are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Law.

**Section 3.** The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:

- (a) Current funds are not required by the Law to be provided as a down payment prior to the issuance of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation thereof in accordance with Section 107.00 of the Law.
- (b) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will exceed five (5) years.
- Section 4. The serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said serial bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.
- Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals of said notes and of Section 21.00, Section 23.00, Section 50.00, Sections 56.00 to 60.00, Section 62.00, Section 63.00 and Section 164.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the County Legislature pertaining or incidental to the sale and issuance of the obligations herein authorized, including but not limited to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, are hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer of the County.

# A RESOLUTION OPPOSING NEW YORK STATE'S NEW BACKGROUND CHECKS AND FEES FOR FIREARM AND AMMUNITION PURCHASES

WHEREAS, The State of New York has recently implemented background check requirements for ammunition purchases, including fees of \$2.50 for ammunition and \$9 for firearms, with the intention of enhancing public safety; and

WHEREAS, These fees and regulations place an undue financial burden on law-abiding gun owners and may limit their access to firearms and ammunition; and

WHEREAS, The computer system that is used to conduct the background checks has had operating issues and is cumbersome, time consuming, and has resulted in increased labor costs and loss of sales for businesses that sell firearms and ammunition; and

WHEREAS, Several people in our communities have been denied the purchase of ammunition including community leaders, police officers, fish and game club members, and individuals seeking ammunition for hunting and target shooting; and

WHEREAS, The gun control law signed by Governor Hochul in July 2022, which introduced these background checks, is already facing legal challenges, particularly concerning is its broad definition of "sensitive locations" and restrictions on private properties where carrying a firearm is now prohibited; and

WHEREAS, The fact that the US Supreme Court rejected an emergency order to halt these background checks underscores the growing concern among New York State citizens and business owners, potentially impacting the operations of gun shops and leading to job losses; and

WHEREAS, Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas recently announced that he will hold an emergency conference to hear from the plaintiff's in a lawsuit that calls the background check laws unconstitutional; now, therefore, be it;

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WHEREAS, This Legislative Body strongly opposes unconstitutional attacks on all Americans, especially the constitutional rights of legal qun owners; and

WHEREAS, The members of this Legislative Body urge the policymakers of New York State to reconsider the approach to background checks for ammunition purchases and collaborate with stakeholders to develop alternative solutions that prioritize public safety while upholding the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the members of this Legislative Body encourages New York State leaders to address the root causes of gun violence, including mental health issues, the negative impacts of bail reforms initiatives that release repeat offenders, and increase and support, law enforcement efforts to combat the use and trafficking of illegal firearms in our communities; and, be it further

**RESOLVED,** That the Clerk of the Legislature transmit a copy of this resolution to Governor Kathy Hochul, Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart Cousins, Senator Jake Ashby, Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie, Assemblyman Scott Bendett, Assemblyman John McDonald, and any other elected officials deemed necessary.
