Be it enacted by the Legislature of the County of Rensselaer as follows:

SECTION 1. - Definitions:

- (a) Agreement. The term "agreement" means a written contract between a food service establishment and a third-party food delivery service authorizing the inclusion of the food service establishment's menu or products on the third-party food delivery service's platform.
- (b) Food service establishment. The term "food service establishment" any fixed or mobile restaurant; drive-in; short-order cafe; delicatessen; luncheonette; grill; tearoom; sandwich shop; soda fountain; bar; tavern; cocktail lounge; night club; roadside stand; take-out prepared food place; retail establishment; private, industrial feeding public nonprofit organization or institution, including: schools; nursing homes; day care centers and hospitals; religious and fraternal organizations routinely serving food; catering kitchens; commissary or similar places in which food is prepared for sale or for service on the premises or elsewhere; and any other establishment operation where food is served or provided for the public, with or without charge.
- (c) Third-party food delivery service. The term "third-party food delivery service" means any website, mobile application or other internet service that offers or arranges for the sale of food and beverages prepared by, and the same-day delivery or same-day pickup

of food and beverages from, food service establishments located in the County that are owned and operated by someone other than the third party food delivery service itself.

(d) Third-party food delivery platform. The term "third-party delivery platform" means the online or mobile electronic platform of the third-party food delivery service on which a consumer may view products available for sale and place an order for a food service establishment's products.

SECTION 2. - Contract Provisions:

It shall be unlawful for a third-party food delivery service to sell a food service establishment's products, or arrange for an order of such products, on a third-party food delivery service platform without a valid written agreement with the food service establishment authorizing the inclusion of their products on such platform.

SECTION 3.- Enforcement:

- (a) A food service establishment included on a third-party food delivery platform in violation of this local law shall have the right to bring an action in a court of competent jurisdiction for damages, penalties as set forth in this section, and injunctive relief. Such court, in its discretion, may also award reasonable court costs and attorneys' fees.
- (b) Any person or company that violates any provision of this local law shall be subject to a civil penalty of up to one thousand dollars per violation. Each day a food service establishment is included on a third-party food delivery platform shall be considered a separate violation. Each and every food service establishment improperly included on a third-party food delivery platform shall be considered a separate violation.

SECTION 4.- State Environmental Quality Review Act Compliance:

This County Legislature determines that the adoption of this Local Law constitutes a "Type II" action" as said term is defined in the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), and that no further action with respect to same is required under SEQRA.

SECTION 5.- Effective Date:

This local law shall take effect 60 days after filing with the New York Secretary of State.

Be It Enacted by the Rensselaer County Legislature as follows:

Section 1. Title

This Local Law shall be known as the "Solid Waste Management Facilities Law of 2021." This Local Law establishes prohibited zones and standards for locating Non-Municipal Solid Waste Management Facilities in Rensselaer County.

Section 2. Legislative Findings and Purpose

The Rensselaer County Legislature hereby finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the residents of the County of Rensselaer to protect the Hudson River as well as Drinking Water Sources in the County from possible contamination and damage from adverse effects caused by locating Non-Municipal Solid Waste Management Facilities, as defined and applicable under Part 360 et seq. of the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, including, but not limited to landfills, transfer stations and waste processing facilities that accept, process, dispose of, combust, gasify, or transfer solid waste for the purpose of disposal, use as a fuel product or transfer to a facility in Rensselaer County or outside the County, within certain distances from the Hudson River as it adjoins the borders of the County of Rensselaer, and Municipal Drinking Water Sources in the County, including, but not limited to, the Tomhannock Reservoir.

The purpose of this local law is to protect public health and safety, as well as the environment, in Rensselaer County, by limiting the location of, or expansion of, any Non-Municipal Solid Waste Management Facilities, as defined and applicable under Part 360 et seq. of the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, including, but not limited to landfills, transfer stations and waste processing facilities that accept, process, dispose of, combust, gasify, or transfer solid waste for the purpose of disposal, use as a fuel product or transfer to a facility in Rensselaer County or outside the County, within certain distances of water bodies and sources as set forth hereafter, located in Rensselaer County.

Section 3. Prohibited Zones and Standards for Locating Non-Municipal Solid Waste Management Facilities in Rensselaer County

The Rensselaer County Legislature hereby prohibits, from the Effective Date of this Local Law, the local and/or state approval of permits, or expansion of, or opening of any Non-Municipal Solid Waste Management Facility, as defined and applicable under Part 360 et seq. of the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, including, but not limited to landfills, transfer stations and waste processing facilities that accept, process, dispose of, combust, gasify, or transfer solid waste for the purpose of disposal, use as a fuel product or transfer to a facility in Rensselaer County or outside the County within the following distances from the applicable water bodies or sources in Rensselaer County:

- a) One half (.5) miles from the shoreline of the Hudson River or the Tomhannock Reservoir;
- b) Five hundred (500) feet from any Regulated Public Water Supply;
- c) Two hundred (200) feet from any Non-Regulated Surface Water Supply Sources;
- d) Two hundred (200) feet from any Non-Permitted Residential Wells.

Section 4. Public Hearings

The Rensselaer County Legislature has conducted public hearings and gathered information on what safeguards need to be put in place to assure that the public health and environment of Rensselaer County are not put in jeopardy from the operation of, or expansion of, any Non-Municipal Solid Waste Management Facilities, as defined and applicable under Part 360 et seq. of the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, including, but not limited to landfills, transfer stations and waste processing facilities that accept, process, dispose of, combust, gasify, or transfer solid waste for the purpose of disposal, use as a fuel product or transfer to a facility in Rensselaer County or outside the County, and the above listed prohibited zones and standards reflect the results of such information gathering.

Section 5. State Environmental Quality Review Act compliance

This County Legislature determines that the adoption of this Local Law constitutes a "Type II action" as said term is defined in the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), and that no further action with respect to same is required under SEORA.

Section 6. Preemption

If any part or provision of this Local Law is inconsistent with any federal or state statute, law, rule or regulation, then such statute, law, rule or regulation shall prevail. If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision of or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law, or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances.

Section 7. Reverse Preemption

This Law shall be null and void on the day that statewide or federal legislation goes into effect, incorporating either the same or substantially similar provisions as are contained in this Law, or in the event that a pertinent state or federal administrative agency issues and promulgates regulations preempting such action by the County of Rensselaer. The Rensselaer County Legislature may determine via resolution whether or not identical or substantially similar statewide legislation has been enacted for the purposes of triggering the provisions of this Section.

Section 8. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, subdivision or other part of this Local Law or its applications shall be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or otherwise invalidate the remainder of this Local Law, which shall remain in full force and effect except as limited by such order or judgment.

Section 9. Effective Date

This Law shall take effect immediately upon its filing with the Office of the New York State Secretary of State.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY TO SUPPORT THE FUNDING OF DESIGN AND ENGINEERING COSTS FOR A PROJECT FOR HUDSON VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
- BUREAU OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING

WHERAS, Hudson Valley Community College (the "College") began as a community response to the needs of Rensselaer County (the "County") and neighboring counties following World War II, and since its inception in 1953, the College has been sponsored by the County under the supervision of the State University of New York, as one of the network of community colleges in the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, The College has been located at its present site at 80 Vandenburgh Avenue (also known as US Route 4) within the municipalities of the City of Troy and the Town of North Greenbush since 1960; and

WHEREAS, The College is well established in the community and much of the commercial development along US Route 4 grew up in response to the needs of the College in support of its mission and students; and

WHEREAS, The College has recognized that there is a continued need in the manufacturing industry for expanded training of the skilled and technical trades in order to fill more jobs and increase productivity; and

WHEREAS, The College proposes to create an Applied Technology Education Center (ATEC) (the "Project") within its existing campus foot print on Vandenburgh Avenue, with the Project to include a new facility to house ATEC activities; and

WHERAS, It is anticipated that the new facility will be a net zero energy building, will house the College's Office of Workforce Development, and will be constructed in an existing parking lot on the south side of the College's campus; and

WHERAS, The estimated cost of the Project is \$75,000,000.00, which includes demolition of Williams Hall and the renovation of Cogan Hall; and

WHEREAS, By Resolution G/158/18, the Rensselaer County Legislature approved and consented to the formation of the Rensselaer County Capital Resource Corporation to assist, among others, not for profit corporations that are undertaking projects that further any of the following purposes; (1) relieving and reducing unemployment, (2) promoting and providing for additional and maximum employment, (3) bettering and maintaining job opportunities for such jobs, (5) carrying on scientific research for the purpose of aiding a community or geographical area by attracting new industry to the community of area or by encouraging the development of, or retention of, an industry in the community or area, and (6) lessening the burdens of government and acting in the public interest; and

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF BLADES AND SHOES FOR SNOWPLOWS AND LEVELING WINGS — HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, This Resolution is filed with the Rensselaer County Legislature by the Rensselaer County Executive; and

WHEREAS, Bids for the purchase of blades and shoes for snowplows and leveling wings have been solicited and are acceptable based upon the specifications, and the desired agreements are for one (1) year with two (2) additional (1) one year renewal periods, increased by the lesser of three percent (3%) or the annual percent increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the immediately preceding year, if mutually agreeable, provided all vendors continue to meet specifications; and

WHEREAS, Selection of the vendors is based upon lowest cost and availability to the County; and

RESOLUTION URGING NEW YORK STATE GOVERNOR KATHY HOCHUL TO PRIORITIZE THE STATE RESPONSE TO THE DISCOVERY OF PFOS IN POESTENKILL, AND TO CONVENE A MEETING OF THE DRINKING WATER QUALITY COUNCIL TO EXAMINE THE FINDINGS IN POESTENKILL

- WHEREAS, It is the duty of this Legislative Body to represent the needs of the residents of Rensselaer County and to take a stand when their health and safety are at risk; and
- WHEREAS, The Towns of Hoosick, Hoosick Falls, Petersburgh, and Berlin have suffered groundwater contamination that has resulted in testing, monitoring, and some corrective actions; and
- WHEREAS, Other towns and villages in Rensselaer County have also had municipal wells and water systems tested for contaminants to ensure the safety of the drinking water; and
- WHEREAS, It was announced in January that PFOS were found in well water supplies at the Algonquin Middle School and at neighboring homes; and
- WHEREAS, In 2015 the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) notified the residents of Hoosick Falls about PFOA contamination and it took New York State over one year to conduct testing and acknowledge the issue; and
- WHEREAS, In a 2016 New York State Senate Committee meeting Health Commissioner Howard Zucker admitted that he and his staff knew that the Hoosick Falls contamination was dangerous, but did not act accordingly; and
- WHEREAS, In the 2017-2018 New York State Budget, the Drinking Water Quality Council (DWQC) was established by New York State Public Health Law to provide recommendations to the New York State Department of Health on emerging contaminants in drinking water; and
- WHEREAS, It is the responsibility of the DWQC to meet and work to maintain and improve the quality of New York's drinking water supplies and infrastructure, and to address some of the most technically challenging aspects of environmental health and drinking water regulation; and
- WHEREAS, The DWQC is charged with recommending timeframes and frequencies of testing for emerging contaminants but has not met in nearly two years to order testing, or to issue guidance or recommendations; now, therefore, be it

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RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body urges Governor Kathy Hochul and Health Commissioner Howard Zucker to not repeat the mistakes that were made in New York State's handling of the Hoosick Falls contamination, and to act earnestly and openly to work with Rensselaer County, the Town of Poestenkill, the Averill Park School District, and all agencies involved in the ongoing testing and investigations into the contamination found in Poestenkill; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Legislature is directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to Governor Kathy Hochul, the New York State Health Commissioner Howard Zucker, and New York State Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation Basil Seggos, Senator Daphne Jordan, Assemblyman Jake Ashby, and any other official or agency deemed necessary by this body.
