WHEREAS, All purchases, made under this grant, will be done under the purchasing guidelines set forth in the Purchasing Policies and Procedures of the County of Rensselaer; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That any positions, programs, expenditures and/or agreements or contracts authorized or established pursuant to this resolution shall terminate and cease upon discontinuance of said funding; and, be it further

WHEREAS, This Resolution is filed with the Rensselaer County Legislature by the Rensselaer County Executive; and

WHEREAS, Article 9 of the New York Energy Law (the "Act") authorizes municipalities and school districts to enter into contracts ("Energy Performance Contracts") for the provision of energy services, including but not limited to, electricity, heating, ventilation, cooling, steam or hot water, in which a person agrees to install, maintain, or manage energy systems or equipment to improve the energy efficiency of, or produce energy in connection with, a building or facility in exchange for a portion of the energy savings or revenues; and

WHEREAS, Rensselaer County (the "County") issued a Request for Proposals (RFP-13-37) for a performance-based energy savings and operations plan for various county facilities; and

WHEREAS, Based on the evaluation of the proposals, Siemens Industry Inc. ("Siemens") was selected to develop and implement a performance-based energy savings and operations plan; and

WHEREAS, Siemens has provided the County with Facility Improvement Measures for the Rensselaer County Building located at 7th Avenue and State Street, Troy, dated December 20, 2022, which sets forth detailed design plans for improvements including demolition of the existing garage, reconstruction of the existing retaining wall, asbestos abatement design services, geotechnical engineering, install guard rails around the retention wall, parking lot construction, security cameras and exterior pole lights; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the County Legislature of Rensselaer County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with Section 9-103 of the Act, the County is hereby authorized to enter into one or more energy performance agreements with Siemens Industry Inc. and related lease/purchase agreements with Siemens Public, Inc. (collectively the "Agreements") in an aggregate original principal amount not to exceed \$2,378,692.00, pursuant to which Siemens will provide equipment, capital improvements, repairs, ongoing preventative maintenance and other services to improve the energy efficiency of the 7th Avenue and State Street Rensselaer County Building, as more particularly described in the Agreements and the Facilities Improvement Measures, and to pay reasonable costs of issuance relating to the Agreements.

Section 2. The Chief Fiscal Officer, as Chief Fiscal Officer of the County, is hereby authorized to negotiate and deliver on behalf of the County the Agreements and all other certificates or instruments required in connection therewith provided, however, that all amounts payable by the County pursuant to the Agreements shall be subject to annual appropriation of such payments by the County Legislature. The power to prescribe the terms, forms and covenants of the Agreements is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer, as Chief Fiscal Officer.

Section 3. This Resolution is intended to constitute the declaration of the County's "official intent" to reimburse the costs of the improvements described in Section 1 of this resolution with proceeds from the Lease/Purchase Agreements with Siemens Public, Inc., as required by Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. This Resolution is not subject to a mandatory or permissive referendum.

Section 5. The County hereby determines that the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations thereunder have previously been satisfied with respect to the expenditures authorized by this Resolution.

Section 6. All acts previously taken by the County with respect to the execution and delivery of the Agreements are hereby further authorized, with the assistance of, and subject to the approval of the County Attorney, ratified and confirmed.

Section 7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION URGING THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO CONTINUE TO PASS-THRU FEDERAL AFFORDABLE CARE ACT ENHANCED FEDERAL MEDICAID ASSISTANCE PERCENTAGE FUNDS

WHEREAS, The SFY 2024 State Budget proposal would end the Affordable Care Act (ACA) enhanced Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (eFMAP) federal pass-thru to counties and New York City; and

WHEREAS, The State is proposing to end a 20 year precedent, and will keep all of these federal savings going forward, and use them to cover further expansions of Medicaid eligibility and benefits, and to increase payments to health care providers; and

WHEREAS, The elimination of this ACA eFMAP federal pass-thru will require the 57 counties to spend nearly \$300 million more in SFY 2024, and approximately \$1 billion when New York City is included; and

WHEREAS, The SFY 2024 costs to counties and New York City are scheduled to grow by 30 percent by SFY 2027; and

WHEREAS, It is the strong view of NYSAC that congress intended these federal savings to be shared with counties proportional to the amount they contributed toward the nonfederal Medicaid match; and

WHEREAS, Since 2003, the state has shared the funds proportionally based on an analysis of savings received during periods when an enhanced federal Medicaid match was enacted by Congress; and

WHEREAS, Enacted in 2011, the Medicaid statutory cap for all 62 counties is \$7.6 billion. The Medicaid statutory cap for the 57 counties outside of New York City is \$2.25 billion; and

WHEREAS, Starting in SFY 2014, New York began sharing these federal ACA savings directly with counties. The savings for a year were provided by lowering the weekly payments each county and NYC make to the state to support the State's Medicaid program. Through February 1, 2023, the state continues to share the federal savings from the ACA eFMAP with the 57 counties and NYC; and

WHEREAS, Counties strongly disagree with the need to cut county funding so deeply when the Governor's budget proposes to fully fund its own reserves two years ahead of schedule by depositing \$5.4 billion into reserves before the end of SFY 2023, while also projecting a general fund surplus of \$35 billion by the end of SFY 2024; now, therefore, be it

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF APRIL 2023 AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH IN RENSSELAER COUNTY

WHEREAS, Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) is an annual campaign to raise public awareness about sexual assault and educate communities and individuals on how to prevent sexual violence; and

WHEREAS, Each year during the month of April, state, community based organizations, rape crisis centers, government agencies, businesses, campuses and individuals plan events and activities to highlight sexual violence, including child sexual abuse, sex trafficking and stalking as a public health, human rights and social justice issue and reinforce the need for prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS, A sexual violence act is committed every 98 seconds in the United States according to law enforcement statistics. Women ages 16-19 are four times more likely than the general population to be victims of rape or sexual assault; and 70% of rapes are committed by someone the victim knows; and

WHEREAS, As early as 1976, "Take Back the Night" marches rallied women in organized protest to highlight the violence and fear that women encountered walking the streets at night. Over time these events coordinated a movement across the United States and broader awareness of violence against women in all forms began to occur; and

WHEREAS, President Obama was the first United States president to declare April as Sexual Awareness Month in a proclamation dated April 1, 2010; and

WHEREAS, The 2023 theme is "Healing the Planet through Community": Recognizing that the prevention of sexual violence and supporting survivors is a shared responsibility among all community members. In addition, lifting the stigma around sexual assault will encourage victims to come forward and prosecute attackers and allow authorities to provide victims assistance and help to heal; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body recognizes April 2023 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month in Rensselaer County and endeavors to promote that each day of the month and throughout the year is an opportunity to create change for the future and take us one step closer to a culture without sexual violence.

RESOLUTION URGING NEW YORK STATE TO DIRECT GRANT MONEYS TO THE LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENT EFFORT IN THE CITY OF TROY

WHEREAS, A 2019 lead service line replacement plan report published by the New York State Department of Health shows 1,175 Troy children with elevated blood lead levels above 5 µg/dL over a five-year period; and

WHEREAS, Lead is a dangerous and pervasive neurotoxin for which there is no safe level of exposure or concentration, the impacts of which may impact speech, learning, attentiveness, antisocial behaviors, comas, convulsions, and even death; and

WHEREAS, Troy has detected such high levels of lead in its drinking water that it recently exceeded the US Environmental Protection Agency action level for lead; and

WHEREAS, Troy estimates that there are approximately 4,500 lead service lines throughout the City, each of which is estimated to cost \$5,000 to replace; and

WHEREAS, The constitutionality of raising revenue through taxes and fees to replace lead service lines is currently unresolved, and the constitutionality of using grant moneys to replace lead service lines is unambiguous; and

WHEREAS, Proposed increases to the City's water rate to finance the replacement of lead service lines would disproportionately impact the City's most financially precarious residents; and

WHEREAS, The Governor and State Legislature have appropriated \$4.5 billion for the Clean Water Infrastructure Act since 2017, which can provide grants for lead service line replacements at the discretion of the Governor; and

WHEREAS, The Governor has only allocated \$30 million in Clean Water Infrastructure Act funding for lead service line replacement since 2017, with no new lead service line replacement awards made since 2019; and

WHEREAS, There is over \$1 billion in Clean Water Infrastructure Act funding that has not yet been allocated to a particular program and which could be used for lead service line replacement; and

WHEREAS, New York State has access to additional grant funding for lead service line replacement through the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, with \$115 million in grants and loans available this year; and

WHEREAS, In his State of the Union address, President Biden addressed this national health crisis and the importance of replacing lead pipes to ensure that all Americans have clean water to drink; and

WHEREAS, New Yorkers have a legitimate expectation that the municipal water from their taps will be clean and safe to drink, and that their children will be safe in their own homes; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Rensselaer County Legislature urges New York State to direct Clean Water Infrastructure Act, Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, and other grant moneys to the City of Troy for the purposes of replacing the City's dangerous lead service lines expediently; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Rensselaer County Legislature urges local, state, and federal officials who represent Troy to proactively and aggressively pursue those moneys as they become available.
