WHEREAS, This Resolution is filed with the Rensselaer County Legislature by the Rensselaer County Executive; and

WHEREAS, The Rensselaer County Public Defender, the Rensselaer County Conflict Defender, and the Rensselaer Public Administrator received a grant (Distribution #11 - Contract Number C110038) in the total amount of \$544,146.00 from the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services for the period from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2023, pursuant to the authority granted by Resolution G/142/22; and

WHEREAS, Resolution G/410/23 authorized the extension of this grant to December 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, There are unexpended monies, including Year 1 (1/1/2021-12/31/2021) funds totaling \$181,382.00 that were never budgeted, for the Office of the Public Defender, Office of the Conflict Defender and Office of the Public Administrator; and

WHEREAS, The following lists the amount of funds remaining in each of the original accounts, which need to be budgeted within 2024; and

WHEREAS, All purchases, made under this grant, will be done under the purchasing guidelines set forth in the Purchasing Policies and Procedures of the County of Rensselaer; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, That any positions, programs, expenditures and/or agreements or contracts authorized or established pursuant to this resolution shall terminate and cease upon discontinuance of said funding; and, be it further

#### Resolution No. G/114/24

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE PROTECTION OF COUNTY HOME RULE, THE RENSSELAER COUNTY CHARTER AND THE RIGHTS OF RENSSELAER COUNTY RESIDENTS IN RELATION TO NEW YORK LEGISLATION A04282B/S03505

WHEREAS, This Resolution is filed with the Rensselaer County Legislature by the Rensselaer County Executive; and

WHEREAS, New York State has enacted legislation (A0282B/S03505) amending Town law, Village law, County law, and the Municipal Home Rule law in relation to moving elections for certain Local Elected Officials to even-numbered years; and

WHEREAS, The enacted State Legislation is violative of the expansive Home Rule rights granted to all Counties through the New York State Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Home Rule is embedded within New York State Constitution Article IX and empowers Counties to adopt alternative forms of Local Governments, a significant power that is intended to be free from State intrusion into matters of local concern; and

WHEREAS, Article IX of the Constitution provides for a Bill of Rights, affording Counties all of the autonomy, powers, and protections required for the management of its affairs and effective self-government; and

WHEREAS, The enacted State Legislation conflicts with and violates the Rensselaer County Charter, the form of Local Government adopted by Rensselaer County Local Law #3 for the year 1972 and approved by the voters of this County at a public referendum; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.01 of the Rensselaer County Charter states that the purpose of the Rensselaer County Charter is, among other things, "the securing of all possible county home rule"; and

WHEREAS, Section 2.02 of the Rensselaer County Charter states: "Members of the County Legislature shall be elected at the General election in odd-numbered years for terms of four (4) years"; and

WHEREAS, Section 2.05 of the Rensselaer County Charter requires members of the County Legislature to be elected in odd numbered years; and

WHEREAS, Section 3.01 of the Rensselaer County Charter states that the County Executive: "His term of office shall be four (4) years and he shall run for office concurrently with the Legislature"; and

WHEREAS, Section 3.03.A of the Rensselaer County Charter imposes a duty on the County Executive to "execute and enforce all laws"; and

WHEREAS, Section 155.1.(f) of the Alternative County Government Law imposes a duty on the County Executive to "[s]ee that all laws of the state and all county acts pertaining to the administration of county government are enforced"; and

WHEREAS, It is necessary to commence civil litigation to protect Rensselaer County's Home Rule powers and preserve its duly adopted Rensselaer County Charter; now, therefore, be it;

WHEREAS, Across the nation in times of intense personal crisis and community-wide disasters, the first access point for those seeking all classes of emergency services and homeland security information is 9-1-1. The local and county public safety communications centers that receive these calls have emerged as the first and single point of contact for persons seeking immediate relief during an emergency; and

WHEREAS, When an emergency occurs the prompt response of police officers, firefighters and paramedics is critical to the protection of life and preservation of property; and

WHEREAS, The safety of our police officers and firefighters is dependent upon the quality and accuracy of information obtained from citizens who telephone the Rensselaer County communications center; and

WHEREAS, Public Safety Dispatchers are the first and most critical contact our citizens have with emergency services; and

WHEREAS, Public Safety Dispatchers are the single vital link for our police officers and firefighters by monitoring their activities by radio, providing them information and ensuring their safety; and

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WHEREAS, Public Safety Dispatchers of the Rensselaer County communications center have contributed substantially to the apprehension of criminals, suppression of fires and treatment of patients. Each dispatcher has exhibited compassion, a sense of calmness, reassurance and professionalism during the performance of their job in the past year; now, therefore, be it

# RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE UNITED STATES POST OFFICE COMMEMORATING BETSY DOYLE ON A UNITED STATES STAMP

WHEREAS, American women of every culture, class, and ethnic background have made historic contributions to the growth and strength and character of our Nation, State, and County in recorded and unrecorded ways; and

WHEREAS, Betsy Doyle was born around 1790 and through her years known as: Betsy, Fannie and Mary; and

WHEREAS, Betsy's husband, Andrew Doyle was born in St. David's, Canada in 1788 and like many women from this time, some of Betsy's history is unknown; and

WHEREAS, Andrew Doyle enlisted as a private in the First Regiment of United States Artillery, commanded by Colonel John Roger Fenwick at Fort Niagara on February 2, 1810 when tensions with Britain were heating up; and

WHEREAS, Betsy accompanied her husband Andrew to Fort Niagara, where they had four children; and

WHEREAS, Accompanying her husband to Fort Niagara, Betsy would have been put to work as a washerwoman or hospital matron, doing most likely the drudge work of cleaning soiled linen, cleaning rooms and preparing food; and

WHEREAS, In June of 1812 war was declared against Great Britain and on October 13, 1812, the United States decided to invade Canada resulting in the Battle of Queenston; and

WHEREAS, On the afternoon of October 12, 1812 Betsy's husband Andrew marched from Fort Niagara to Lewiston Landing to join the battle in Queenston. The following day, October 13, 1812 following a fierce battle with the British Army, Andrew was captured and deemed "Subjects of the Crown" by the British; and

WHEREAS, Andrew was taken to Quebec and then aboard a British Warship and sailed to England to stand trial as traitors to the Crown; and

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WHEREAS, Betsy, having no knowledge of her husband's circumstances at this time, remained at Fort Niagara; and

Betsy's Heroism

WHEREAS, On November 21, 1812 at 6:00pm the British stationed at Fort George opened fire with their batteries of guns and cannons on Fort Niagara. Fort Niagara returned heavy fire. Among the artillery barrage, the Americans on the rooftops of buildings in Fort Niagara fired "Hot Shot" from cannons; and

WHEREAS, Hot Shot is non-explosive cannonballs heated red hot for the purpose of setting fire to enemy buildings, ships or equipment. Loading the hot shot was difficult and dangerous. The hot iron could cause gunpowder to explode prematurely in the cannon, wounding or killing anyone nearby; and

WHEREAS, Betsy carried red-hot cannonballs from a fire to the 6-pound cannon mounted on the roof of the mess-hall; and

WHEREAS, Although one man was killed and five others wounded while loading hot shot, Betsy survived, and her bravery was mentioned in the official reports. The story of her actions spread quickly among officers stationed in the region. Reading: Betsy's Heroism is Recorded in the Journal of Lt. Colonel George Mcfeely, Commander of Fort Niagara. "One man was killed and four wounded from the bursting of one of our twelve pounders, this was occasioned by a hot ball which had expanded by the heat and got fast in the gun, where a vacuum was formed and when fired burst into ten thousand pieces. Another twelve pounder went off when the man was in the act of ramming and took off both his hands about the wrist, this was owing to the gun getting very hot and the man at the vent having no thumb stool (stall). The extraordinary bravery of a female drew the attention of all our garrison: her name was Betsy Doyle, her husband was taken prisoner at Queenston in the fall under General Van Rensselaer. She attended and served one of the guns with hot shot during the day of the cannonading. She would take the ball tongs from any of the men, run to the fire, take up the hot shot, put it in the cannon, and run for another; this she continued for the whole of the day". I mentioned this circumstance in my official letter to General Smyth; and

WHEREAS, Betsy's journey was not over; and

WHEREAS, In early December of 1813, Fort Niagara fell to the British. In a letter dated April 5, 1814 written by Colonel Simon Larned, Commander of Greenbush Cantonment he stated the following account: "The day before the Enemy took the fort (December 19, 1813), she encouraged the militia who was rather timid, by putting on the dress and arms of a soldier and went on Guard and stood her turn through a very dark and rainy night. She, the next day, continued at her House until the Enemy British and Indians had almost surrounded her, when she fortunately escaped with four children, the eldest about 14."; and

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WHEREAS, On December 19, 1813 Betsy and the children fled with whatever they had on their backs heading East to escape the British forces. Having nowhere to go, certainly not to her in-laws in Canada, she headed to the hub of the US Army at Greenbush Cantonment, a 310 mile walk in the winter; and

WHEREAS, In April of 1814 Betsy and three of the four children (It is unknown at this time what happened to the fourth child) arrived at Greenbush Cantonment; and

WHEREAS, Upon arriving at Greenbush Cantonment, it was evident the long winter journey had taken its toll on Betsy. Colonel Larned wrote: "She is now in my Kitchen and convalescing from a fever. She appears to be an industrious and worthy woman." Betsy knew her husband, Andrew was prisoner of the British and taken to England. After the war ended she stayed on at Greenbush Cantonment working in the hospital and awaiting the arrival of her husband and, at one point, it was wrongly determined that Andrew had died in the harsh conditions of the British prison; and

WHEREAS, Andrew Doyle was never tried and was released from prison in 1815 and returned to America; but he was unable to find Betsy; and

WHEREAS, Andrew arrived back in the United States through Castle Island, Boston, MA on August 14, 1815. Unable to locate Betsy, he assumed she was dead. On January 17, 1819, Andrew married Nancy Sherman of Connecticut. Together they had a son and daughter. Nancy Sherman Doyle died in Providence, Rhode Island on December 31, 1861 at the age of 81. Andrew Doyle died on July 29, 1875 at the age of 87; and

WHEREAS, Betsy Doyle died at Greenbush Cantonment on April 2, 1819. In a letter written by Lt. Henry Smith of the 2 US Infantry Regiment, Acting Post Commandant of Greenbush Cantonment to Brigadier General Daniel Parker on April 4, 1819 stating: "You will perceive that Mrs. Doyle the nurse has not been paid in a year. During the whole of that time she has been in the faithful discharge of her duty at this Post, and to my knowledge, nearly the whole of that time Maj. Worth, (late commandant here) has been endeavoring, by correspondence with Paymaster Albright, Dr. Le Baron, the Paymaster General plus others to procure it for her, in vain. On Major Worth leaving the Post, I enclosed a copy the Muster rolls, A. to Surgeon General Lovell, stating the case plus requesting his attention to the business. Since then, nearly three months have elapsed and the Doctor. has not favored me with an answer of any kind, nor attended, as I can hear to the business. About a month since, Mrs. Doyle was confined by illness to her bed, and the day before yesterday she died and I am sorry to say, her death was accelerated by the want of those necessities which her pay would have procured-She left a daughter whose father (a soldier) is also dead and who is now left friendless on the world without any possible means of support and it is on her account I have to request your interference to procure, for her the pay so hardly earned and so justly owed her mother. --Independent of the calls of humanity, duty compels me to make the above statement; now, therefore, be it

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**RESOLVED,** That the Rensselaer County Legislature did proudly declare April 2024 as Betsy Doyle Month in Rensselaer County and fully support the efforts of the East Greenbush Town Historian to commemorate Betsy on a United States Stamp to further recognize this amazing woman and share her story of bravery and heroism in such trying times; and, be it further

**RESOLVED**, Betsy Doyle's story continues to inspire and give strength to men and women around the world, two hundred and five years since her death and Rensselaer County will continue to honor her and tell her story; and, be it further

**RESOLVED**, That the Clerk of the Legislature transmit a copy of this resolution, suitably engrossed, to Bobbie Reno, the Town of East Greenbush Town Historian.

# RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF APRIL 2024 AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH IN RENSSELAER COUNTY

WHEREAS, Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) is an annual campaign to raise public awareness about sexual assault and educate communities and individuals on how to prevent sexual violence; and

WHEREAS, Each year during the month of April, state, community based organizations, rape crisis centers, government agencies, businesses, campuses and individuals plan events and activities to highlight sexual violence, including child sexual abuse, sex trafficking and stalking as a public health, human rights and social justice issue and reinforce the need for prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS, A sexual violence act is committed every 98 seconds in the United States according to law enforcement statistics. Women ages 16-19 are four times more likely than the general population to be victims of rape or sexual assault; and 70% of rapes are committed by someone the victim knows; 33% of adults with intellectual disabilities have experienced sexual violence; and 47% of all transgender people have been sexually assaulted at some point in their life; and

WHEREAS, As early as 1976, "Take Back the Night" marches rallied women in organized protest to highlight the violence and fear that women encountered walking the streets at night. Over time these events coordinated a movement across the United States and broader awareness of violence against women in all forms began to occur; and

WHEREAS, President Obama was the first United States president to declare April as Sexual Awareness Month in a proclamation dated April 1, 2010; and

WHEREAS, The 2024 theme is "Building Connected Communities": Building community is powerful. Community creates a sense of belonging and reminds us of how our beliefs, choices and actions impact one another. At the center of building communities is ensuring our communities are safe, inclusive, and equitable. Racism, sexism, classism, heterosexism, ageism, ableism, and other forms of oppression contribute to a higher rate of sexual harassment, assault, and abuse. We must address all abuses of power to prevent sexual violence, in our relationships, communities, and society; and

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WHEREAS, Recognizing that the prevention of sexual violence and supporting its survivors is a shared responsibility among all community members. In addition, lifting the stigma around sexual assault will encourage victims to come forward and prosecute attackers and allow authorities to provide victims assistance and help the healing process; now, therefore, be it
