# RESOLUTION OF THE RENSSELAER COUNTY LEGISLATURE URGING THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO ADOPT "CHELSEY'S LAW"

WHEREAS, The misuse and abuse of controlled substances have led to an alarming increase in overdose deaths throughout New York State, affecting countless families and communities; and

WHEREAS, Despite many programs administered and supported by Rensselaer County, deadly overdoses are still occurring in Rensselaer County; and

WHEREAS, Existing laws do not adequately address the accountability of individuals who knowingly distribute or administer controlled substances that lead to fatal overdoses; and

WHEREAS, "Chelsey's Law" proposes to amend the penal code to create stricter penalties for those who knowingly sell, administer, deliver, or cause the delivery of controlled substances that result in death; and

WHEREAS, "Chelsey's Law" provides that a person commits the crime of manslaughter or aggravated manslaughter when he or she knows or has reasonable grounds to know that a controlled substance is likely to cause the death of another person and sells, administers, delivers, or causes the delivery of a controlled substance to another person and such substance causes, contributes to, or aids in the death of such other person; and

WHEREAS, The adoption of "Chelsey's Law" would serve as a significant deterrent to the distribution of dangerous drugs and provide justice for the victims and their families; and

WHEREAS, The Rensselaer County Legislature recognizes the urgent need to address the opioid crisis and other drug-related fatalities through comprehensive legislative measures; now, therefore, be it

# RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING RUSSELL SAGE COLLEGE PRESIDENT CHRISTOPHER AMES UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT

WHEREAS, Consistent with the duty of this Legislative Body to acknowledge those individuals and institutions who have contributed to the vitality of Rensselaer County, we recognize with profound respect and admiration an important figure in the history of the community; and

WHEREAS, Attendant to such duty and fully in accord with its longstanding traditions, it is the intent of this Legislative Body to convey its compliments and felicitations to Russell Sage College President Christopher Ames upon the occasion of his retirement on June 30, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Russell Sage College was originally founded in 1916 by Margaret Olivia Slocum Sage and named in honor of her late husband, who had left her a considerable fortune. The college proposed to offer women independence through a broad liberal arts education and specific professional careers; and

WHEREAS, President Ames is The Sage Colleges  $10^{\rm th}$  President, when he joined in 2017 after serving as Provost at Shepherd University, a public institution in West Virginia; and

WHEREAS, President Ames is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate from the University of Texas at Austin, and he earned a Ph.D. in English Literature at Stanford University. He taught 20<sup>th</sup>-century literature and film for 15 years at Agnes Scott College, a liberal arts college for women in Atlanta, GA. He has published two books: The Life of the Party: Festive Vision in Modern Fiction and Movies About the Movies: Hollywood Reflected; and

WHEREAS, His tenure at Russell Sage was marked by an intense period of change that moved the college from a once precarious financial position to five consecutive years of budget surpluses. His fundraising efforts yielded more than \$ 30 million to advance the College; and

WHEREAS, Under President Ames' leadership, the College, which was divided into an all-women's college in Troy and a co-educational college in Albany merged and rebranded into one institution under the Russell Sage College name, offering bachelor's, master's, and doctoral programs to more than 2100 students; and

#### RESOLUTION FOR THE RENSSELAER COUNTY LEGISLATURE TO REPEAL LOCAL LAW T-3

WHEREAS, The Rensselaer County Legislature passed Local Law T-3 on December 12, 2023, establishing the Rensselaer County Drug Registry with the intent to serve as a deterrent to the trafficking of illegal drugs following a surge in fentanyl related deaths in the county; and

WHEREAS, Subsequent to passing the Rensselaer County Drug Registry it was established that New York State does not have the necessary enabling legislation for this law which expands the sentence of a convicted drug dealer after they have served their time; and

WHEREAS, The provisions of the Rensselaer County Drug Registry are not compatible with the intent of the 2017 Raise the Age legislation passed by New York State; and

WHEREAS. Are in violation of the NYS Clean Slate Act of 2024; and

WHEREAS, New York State requires notice of a public hearing and a public hearing before passing a local law and there is no record of notice or a public hearing on the Drug Dealer Registry; therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, That this Legislative body embraces legal and responsible procedures and recognizes the potential of legal ramifications that will manifest from procedural flaws in enacting this legislation; and, be it further

**RESOLVED,** That it is the sole responsibility of this Legislature to admit their oversight and here by repeal Local Law T-3, known also as the Drug Dealer Registry.
