**FAMILY HISTORY:**

**William E. Haggerty JR. was born on September 25, 1932 in Troy, New York. William was the son of the late William Haggerty and Kathleen Crummy Haggerty and brother of the late Patricia Haggerty Lamb. Ned grew up in Green Island and lived in Lansingburgh for most of his life.**

**EDUCATION:**

**Ned graduated from Heatly High School in Green Island, New York, Class of 1950.**

**HISTORY:**

**Ned served in the United States Army during the Korean War. He began his active duty on November 18, 1952. While serving during the Korean War, Ned was seriously wounded on July 4, 1953 on Pork Chop Hill, where he received his second Purple Heart. He spent most of his recovery in Japan. Ned was the recipient of two purple hearts, Korean Service Medal W/1 Bronze Service Stars, United Nations Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, and Combat Infantry Medal. He was honorably discharged on October 16, 1954.**

**Ned is survived by his two children; William Haggerty III and Erin Haggerty Duffy, and his four grandchildren; Sean, Heather, Bridgette, and Brendan.**

**Ned worked as a special agent with Continental Insurance Company for many years and then worked as a clerk at the Troy Post Office where he retired in his late 70's.**
