WHEREAS, Rensselaer County is mandated to provide and assure the availability of non-secure detention facilities as well as alternatives to detention; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Social Services ("Department") seeks to continue to contract with Berkshire Farm Center and Services for Youth ("Berkshire Farm") for non-secure detention services as well as an intensive prevention program, which includes providing immediate assessment of youth and family functioning, crisis intervention, respite service and in-home service to the youth and family; and

WHEREAS, Berkshire Farm staff go to Family Court and advocate for the child to remain in their home with services or electronic monitoring; and

WHEREAS, Berkshire Farm is the only service provider in the Capital Region that can provide both the non-secure detention services as well as the wrap-around services necessary to shorten the length of time in detention or prevent the remand to detention; and

WHEREAS, Effective January 1, 2022, Berkshire Farm will provide Rensselaer County with one reserved bed, at a per diem rate of \$443.00, and will accommodate an additional non-secure detention request only if the unreserved bed is available and remains available, at a per diem rate of \$495.00; and

WHEREAS, If an unreserved bed becomes unavailable the County will need to remove the youth by $5:00\ PM$; and

WHEREAS, The Adopted 2022 Rensselaer County Budget provides funding for these contracts within budgetary codes A.6123.04700 and A.6070.04747; and

RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE WEST SAND LAKE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT UPON THE OCCASION OF THEIR 150TH ANNIVERSARY

WHEREAS, This Legislative body endeavors to recognize those individuals and organizations who, through their service and dedication contribute to the climate and fabric of Rensselaer County; and

WHEREAS, Attendant to such duty and fully in accord with its longstanding tradition, it is the intent of this Legislative Body to convey compliments to the West Sand Lake Volunteer Fire Department which has protected and served its community for a remarkable one hundred and fifty years; and

WHEREAS, The West Sand Lake Volunteer Fire Company was the third rural volunteer fire company to be organized in Rensselaer County, and the first in the town of Sand Lake, originating some twenty-eight years before most other rural volunteer fire companies; and

WHEREAS, There were many clothing and fabric mills, sawmills and other mills in West Sand Lake and neighboring communities in the Town of Sand Lake also contained wooden structures, mills, factories and hotels. Because lakes, ponds and streams were plentiful in the region, West Sand Lake was a summertime resort during the nineteenth century; and

WHEREAS, In 1872 a public meeting was held to establish the fire company under the West Sand Lake Board of Village Trustees after several large and very costly mill fires. The West Sand Lake Fire District was officially established in 1876; and

WHEREAS, It is believed that from 1872 to 1874 the firemen used the bucket brigade system. In 1874 the district purchased a hand drawn piece of Fire Equipment, that had belonged to the Lafayette Engine Company No. 3, for a sum of \$500.00. The hand pumper, originally named "Old Joke" by the Lafayette Engine Company was renamed "Old Joe" and was in active service until the mid 1950's when sufficient motorized apparatus made him obsolete. Old Joe is on display in its original Engine Room and altho serviceable only leaves the garage for parades, competitions and occasionally demonstrations to younger members; now, therefore, be it

RESOLUTION COMMENDING STACY POMEROY DRAPER FOR HER DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE HART CLUETT MUSEUM

WHEREAS, A community is only as great as its members who provide exemplary leadership and service and who, through personal and professional dedication, contribute to the fabric and climate of Rensselaer County; and

WHEREAS, Attendant to such duty and fully in accord with the longstanding tradition, it is the intent of this legislative body to convey its compliments and felicitations to Stacy Pomeroy Draper upon her retirement as Hart Cluett Museum curator; and

WHEREAS, Stacy Pomeroy Draper, a graduate of American studies at Smith College and the Cooperstown Graduate Program in History Museum studies, has been telling Rensselaer County stories in over 171 exhibits, over her 43-year career as the curator at the museum; and

WHEREAS, Believing this to be a starter job, Stacy thought she may be employed at the Hart Cluett Museum (formerly known as the Rensselaer County Historical Society) for several years before moving on. Unbeknownst to her, Stacy not only fell in love with her work at the museum, but also found her personal love, her now late husband Steve Draper. They wed at the St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Troy and lived in Lansingburgh, where they raised their daughter Kathryn Draper; and

WHEREAS, Stacy loved local history and was enraptured by getting people excited to hear all different facets of local lore; ranging from Troy's Black community, to the local history of labor, to the lives of the wealthiest residents and how their money transformed downtown Troy's architecture; and

WHEREAS, In 1978 on her second day of work, Stacy was caught up in the filming of the PBS docudrama "The Molders of Troy" about $19^{\rm th}$ -century ironworkers. In 2021 with her retirement in site, her career culminates with providing the historical perspective for the HBO series "The Gilded Age"; and

WHEREAS, Stacy co-authored "The Marble House in Second Street: Biography of a Town House and Its Occupants, 1825-1900" with Douglas Bucher and Richard Wheeler. It tells the story of the Hart-Cluett mansion, the building itself and the people who lived and worked there; and

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WHEREAS, Stacy was known to be a consummate professional, who is totally dedicated to the museum and for her quality work. She was always excited to try something new and was extremely creative in figuring out how to make something work; now, therefore be it

RESOLUTION URGING THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION TO SUPPORT THE CITY OF RENSSELAER'S OPPOSITION TO THE RENEWAL OF THE OPERATING PERMIT OF THE S.A. DUNN & COMPANY LANDFILL

WHEREAS, It is within the authority of this body to act on behalf of Rensselaer County residents at times when their health, safety, and well-being are being negatively impacted by conditions in their neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, In 1998 the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) issued a permit to operate a construction and demolition landfill at what is known as the old Dunn Mine; and

WHEREAS, In 2012, NYSDEC issued a permit to Waste Connections, the current owner of the landfill, to operate the landfill through the year 2022; and

WHEREAS, Presently, this landfill has become the largest construction and demolition landfill in New York State, accepting waste from seven states. As of the end of 2017, nearly 50,000 trucks, an average of 78 trucks per day, have travelled over Partition Street to enter the site; and

WHEREAS, After pressure from the Rensselaer County Legislature, community groups and other entities, the operations at the Dunn landfill were scrutinized by NYSDEC; and

WHEREAS, NYSDEC determined that the landfill was in violation of the New York State issued permit four times in 2018, in specific, dust clouds, excessive truck traffic, unauthorized floodwater disposal and illegal dumping; and

WHEREAS, The local community continues to have concerns about speeding trucks and the excessive noise and pollution from particulate matters that impact Rensselaer and surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, Rensselaer Mayor Michael Stammel recently proposed a unanimously adopted resolution urging NYSDEC to revoke the operating permit of the landfill; and

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WHEREAS, The Town of East Greenbush has also voiced its opposition to the negative impacts of the landfill and has also voiced its opposition to the renewal of the permit; and

WHEREAS, The Rensselaer Environmental Coalition has worked tirelessly to raise awareness about the impacts of the landfill and has kept the public informed with important information from scientists, professionals, and community residents; and

WHEREAS, On October 12th, 2021 this Legislative Body adopted a similar resolution urging Governor Kathy Hochul to use her power to revoke the operating permit of the landfill; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Rensselaer County Legislature does hereby urge the NYSDEC to deny any application to renew the operating permit of the S.A. Dunn & Co. landfill; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of this Legislative Body is hereby directed to transmit certified copies of this resolution to Governor Kathy Hochul and Basil Seggos, Commissioner of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.
